Our discipline matrix is located on our website for major infractions. Teachers implement various classroom systems to promote positive behavior and to address negative behavior. We know mistakes happen and that elementary age children are learning and navigating social emotional skills and experiences. We balance that with the importance of holding children accountable for their choices and actions.

Consequences and supports are provided to help students understand the result of bad choices/inappropriate behavior and to help them learn how to handle situations in a different manner. Since our goal is to have a safe and positive learning environment for all students, parents play an important role. We value two-way communication with parents when discussing positive and negative behaviors. Expect phone calls, emails, and/or meeting requests from HAW staff members asking to talk with you about your child's behavior if concerning behaviors are observed or if incidents occur that need to be addressed. ## Merry Christmas

It's hard to believe it's almost Christmas break which also means colder weather! Unfortunately, with colder weather comes coughs, colds, runny noses, and fevers. Please keep children at home if they are sick and not feeling well, your child may be carrying something very contagious.

#### ~Remember the 24 Hour Rule of Thumb~

Students may return to school after the following: -24 hours without a temperature/fever (>100.4 degrees Fahrenheit) and without taking fever reducing medications such as Tylenol or Advil/Motrin.-24 hours without nausea, vomiting, diarrhea (and tolerating a normal diet).

-24 hours of receiving medication for treatment of illness/infection (such as antibiotics, eye ointments).

#### WHAT DOES RESEARCH SAY?

Did you know that SLEEPING is one of the most important things that we do? Besides allowing your brain rest, sleeping reduces stress, increases memory, reduces the chance of getting heart disease, diabetes, controls body weight and mood disorders.

#### ATTENTION 4TH GRADE PARENTS

This year, Horizon's 4th graders have been chosen to participate in the NAEP (National Assessment of Educational Progress), often called the "Nation's Report Card". This is an awesome opportunity for HAW to represent New Mexico! This assessment is part of the federally required ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act). Fifty of our 4th grade students have been randomly selected by NAEP to participate. If your child was selected, you will receive a notification letter after the winter break. This will not affect your child's grade. Because Horizon 4th graders will participate in this assessment in February, 4th grade will not take the Middle of Year assessments (iMSSA Reading & Math) normally taken in January. #### free dental care

Comfort Dental Care Day is when our offices work to fulfill a promise—to give everyone access to quality dental care they deserve. On December 23, all our locations will offer FREE dental care to those needing care in their community from 7:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

#### about care day

Since 1984, Comfort Dental has offered free dental care to community members on the eve of Christmas Eve. Care Day began as a way to give those without access to dental care a chance to love their smile again. On Care Day, all services are free to anyone, with all patients served on a first-come-first-served basis. Services include anything from simple cleanings to extractions, with more serious problems evaluated on a case-by-case basis. Over 300 Comfort Dental dentists and 1,300 team members will donate their time this Care Day.

In 2021, our offices saw over 4,000 patients nationwide, donating over \$1.4 million in dental services.

Since its beginning in 1984, Care Day has provided over \$22.8 million in dental services for free.

President and Founder of Comfort Dental Dr. Rick Kushner says, "We provide free dental care to help people. If someone has a bad tooth, hopefully we can make them feel better. For some people, including kids, Care Day might be the only time they see a dentist all year. We're dentists, so we give away dental services for the holidays."
